



At age 50, Mark Johnson wanted a career change. What he got was an entirely new life — a life filled with danger, violence and stark moral choices. Johnson tells the story of his unlikely midlife transformation from charity executive to street cop in the explosive new police memoir *Apprehensions & Convictions: Adventures of a 50-Year-Old Rookie Cop* (Quill Driver Books, February 2016).

As the executive director of the United Way of Mobile, Alabama, Johnson had stability, a decent salary and a respected position in the community. What he didn't have was a sense of purpose. Disillusioned with the day-to-day compromises of charity work and looking for a way to make a real difference, Johnson at age 50 became the oldest rookie in the Mobile Police Department.



Defying the skepticism of his wife, the derision of the younger cops who called him "Pawpaw," and his own self-doubts, Johnson rose to become a detective and a highly decorated officer. But it wasn't a smooth ascent. A civilized man whose first instinct is to help people, Johnson learned the hard way that some men can only be subdued with brute force and some chronic criminals refuse to be redeemed.

In a crisp first-person narrative that is by turns action-packed and contemplative, Johnson writes frankly of the experiences, challenges, disillusionments and dangers that transformed him from a social worker to a cop.

Going from fund-raising with socialites to patrolling Mobile's most violent neighborhoods, Johnson found

that poverty, crime, addiction and domestic abuse were no longer abstract social issues, but the daily realities

of the public he served. Not a natural warrior, Johnson had to overcome a lifetime of avoiding confrontation to

learn that he must sometimes use violence, because a cop cannot afford to lose a fight — a lesson dramatically

hammered home on a cold Christmas morning when a scuffle with a car thief turned into a life-or-death struggle

over possession of Johnson's service weapon.

Apprehensions & Convictions chronicles Johnson's gradual transformation from social worker to

detective, along with his occasional relapses into compassion for the unfortunates he arrests. In salty, slangy

language that crackles with the energy of the streets, Apprehensions & Convictions presents vivid portraits of

the addicts, dealers, prostitutes, pimps, thieves, murderers, crime victims and ordinary citizens of Johnson's city.

With the eyes of both a social worker and a cop, Johnson surveys the murderous intersection of drugs, crime and

dysfunction that plagues the inner city and offers some no-nonsense opinions about the roots of crime.

Apprehensions & Convictions also tells a deeply personal story of how Johnson overcame his own demons

to find a new sense of purpose and identity in midlife. From a troubled, drink- and drug-fueled youth, to dealing

with both his birth and adoptive parents, to struggling to find a steady career path, Johnson's story is of a man who

found his courage and changed himself.

Mark Johnson grew up in Luling, Louisiana, and St. Louis, and graduated from the University of Colorado in 1974. Armed with a bachelor's degree in English, he worked as a carpenter, cement finisher, short-order cook, bartender, cabbie, trucker, sales rep, and freelance writer (columnist and features for the *ProRodeo Sports News*, and *Colorado Springs Sun*, among others) until he stumbled into his first career with United Way.

Johnson served as campaign and public relations director for Pikes Peak United Way, executive director of United Way of Waukesha County, Wisconsin, and CEO of the United Way of Southwest Alabama. After working for United Way for over two decades and

raising a career total of over \$100 million for nonprofit health and human services, in 2002 Johnson chucked it all for a badge and a gun and 13 bucks an hour with the Mobile Police Department. He was 50.

As a sworn officer — six years in uniformed patrol, six years as a detective — Johnson received numerous Chief's and Commander's citations for meritorious arrests, and was decorated for Excellent Police Duty (three times, for initiatives resulting in a 33 percent crime reduction in targeted area, apprehension and conviction of a burglary ring responsible for 83 residential burglaries, and for solo arrests and convictions of those responsible for over \$50,000 in commercial thefts), Chief's Unit Medal (for highest local and regional case clearance), Meritorious Service Medal (exceptional service involving grave danger: the apprehension of an escaped cop killer) and the Wounded in Service Medal (for wounds received while engaged in personal combat with an armed adversary in a manner reflecting courage and honor). He also received a handful of "performance observations" and citizen complaints, usually related to inappropriate radio traffic, car wrecks and demeanor issues.

Johnson and his wife Nancy have been married for 40 years; they are the parents of two and the grandparents of five. They live in Fairhope, Alabama.


