





—**Iphis and Ianthe:** Iphis, a girl raised as a boy, falls in love with the maiden Ianthe. Is this love lesbian or transgender? The lovers' happiness hangs in the balance until a miraculous sex-changing intervention by the goddess Isis.

—Plus many other ancient stories, both famous and obscure, that illuminate the oddities, pains and joys of sexual desire.

Dr. Ruth K. Westheimer is one of America's best-known names in relationship therapy. Widely known for her honest and humane approach to human sexuality, Westheimer pioneered frank sex advice on radio with her program *Sexually Speaking*, which premiered in 1980 on WYNY in New York. Since then Westheimer has become America's favorite sex expert, giving help to millions through radio, television, newspapers, magazines, books and her website, **DrRuth.com**.

Born in Germany in 1928, Westheimer was sent to an orphanage in Switzerland at age 10 to escape the Holocaust. At 17 she immigrated to Israel, where she fought as a scout and sniper for the Haganah. She was seriously wounded in 1948 during the Israeli War of Independence.

In 1950, Westheimer moved to France, where she studied psychology at the Sorbonne. In 1956, she immigrated to the United States. Westheimer received a master's degree in sociology from the New School for Social Research and a doctorate of education from Columbia University, and studied human sexuality under Dr. Helen Singer Kaplan at New York Hospital-Cornell University Medical Center.

Dr. Westheimer has taught at New York Hospital-Cornell University Medical Center, Lehman College, Brooklyn College, Adelphi University, Columbia University and West Point. She is currently an adjunct professor at New York University and a fellow of Calhoun College at Yale, Butler College at Princeton and the New York Academy of Medicine. Dr. Westheimer has her own private practice in New York and lectures worldwide. She is the author of over 35 books, including *Dr. Ruth's Sex After 50* (Quill Driver Books, 2005) and *Dr. Ruth's Guide for the Alzheimer's Caregiver* (Quill Driver Books, 2012).

Jerome E. Singerman earned his B.A. at Wesleyan University, where he studied English and Classics, and his M.A. and Ph.D. at Harvard University, where he focused on the afterlife of classical literature in medieval and Renaissance Europe. He has taught literature at Harvard University, Bates College, and the Maryland Institute College of Art and is a frequent speaker on scholarly publishing at colleges, universities, and academic conferences across the country. He is the author of one monograph, *Under Clouds of Poesy: Poetry and Truth in French and English Reworkings of the Aeneid, 1160-1513* (1985); more recently, his articles on museums

and art have appeared in *Antiques* magazine. A longtime book editor, he is the recipient of the 2014 Robert L. Kindrick–CARA Award of the Medieval Academy of America for Outstanding Service to Medieval Studies, the only publisher ever to have been so recognized.

Singerman lives in a century-old house in Philadelphia with his wife, a professor at the University of Pennsylvania.
